- Concerts by The Choir of Emmanuel College, Cambridge: The choir 11. have offered to make us the first stop on their tour, with a performance on: Saturday 3rd July at 7pm and a further, shorter Dementia Friendly concert on: Monday 5th at 12.30pm. At the end of the Saturday programme, Jonathan Dove's minimalist Missa brevis is followed by one of the largest and most spectacular anthems in the repertoire, Finzi's Lo, the full, final sacrifice. Entry will be by donation with all proceeds being split equally between the Church and the choir..
