Coins and notes, dimes and dollars, rand and rupees, pounds and pesos, euros and escudos, krone and kwacha, yen and yuan. Most of us have come back from a foreign holiday with a few coins and notes. These hide in a drawer awaiting our next trip but will we ever go back? So we're asking you to release the foreign currency and to put it to good use today. You won't miss it and it goes to a good home.

During May we are asking you to hand in your spare foreign currency. Please bag it separately but put it in the plate for the small change offering as you enter the Church. As there will probably be many denominations we will process it separately from the normal collection. And please donate notes as well as coins.

The money collected will go to Christian Aid. There is something particularly appropriate about using foreign currency to provide aid to the poorest parts of the world. So please dig deep.
