2. Morningside Hope Concert:

There will be a short reflection by someone from Greenbank followed by some music and then walking down to our church, a second short reflection led by the Minister, followed by some music — a Pilgrimage of Hope. We will finish at 1pm and you would be welcome to bring a packed lunch to eat in the church hall or go home and come back for the 2pm start of the concert.

Everyone is welcome to join in the pilgrimage but equally, if you simply want to attend the concert, you will be made very welcome as always.

3. **Autumn Lectures 2024:** This year's lecture series jointly organised by Morningside and Greenbank will be held in Greenbank Parish Church this year. 6.30pm refreshments, 7pm the lectures commence. The theme will be, "Questions for our Time." Entry by donation. The lectures will be livestreamed and available on the Greenbank website.

15th **September:** Assisted Dying – the Revd Dr Liam Fraser, Convener of the General Assembly Theological Forum, will give a lecture on this recurring and emotive topic.

22nd September: Searching for Renewal in the Mainstream Church – the Revd Neil Glover, minister of a Highland Perthshire Church and Convener of the Seeds for Growth Fund will pose some challenging questions about the future of the Church of Scotland.

- 5. Thomas Chalmers talk, Wednesday 25th September, 3pm, Braid Hall: Earlier in the year the Minister gave a well-received talk about Thomas Chalmers, "Chief Scottish man" which he will be reprising this month. Chalmers was an influential C19th Church of Scotland minister who was one of the chief movers behind the Disruption of the Church of Scotland in 1843 and the formation of the Free Church of Scotland. Latterly he lived in Churchill and was a member of the original Morningside Parish Church. He is buried in the Grange Cemetery. Chalmers' career saw him ministering in different parts of the country, as well as holding several professorial roles at St Andrews and Edinburgh Universities. He was Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, and the first Moderator of the Free Church of Scotland.
- Harvest Foodbank Collection 2024: For many years our Church has 6. been supporting the Blythswood Care SE Edinburgh Foodbank, based at Southhouse Broadway. Throughout the year, donations can be placed in the container beneath the pigeonholes in the Braid corridor, but our biggest effort in contributing to the Foodbank's work is directed towards donating foodstuffs and toiletries at the Harvest Service, to be held this year on 29th September. This year there is a particular shortage of the following items, so donations of these goods would be particularly welcome - tinned meat, fruit, tomatoes, custard and rice pudding. cartons of fruit juice and UHT semi-skimmed milk and toilet rolls. The Foodbank also requires plastic bags, into which the goods for the clients are placed, so donations of these would also be appreciated. Please hand in any donations at the Braid Hall immediately before the 10.30am Service. The Foodbank cannot accept fresh fruit or vegetables or jars of homemade jam. Also, please do remember when donating any items that they must be in date. If you would prefer to make a financial donation to allow the Foodbank to make its own purchases, cash can be handed in to the Foodbank at 47 Southhouse Broadway, EH17 8AS between 10am-1.30pm Monday, Tuesday and Thursdays, For online donations please go to blythswood.org/donate-to-foodbank. In the past, the congregation has always responded so positively to this appeal and so thank you in advance for your continued generosity this year.
