- 1. **Today:** 9.30am Early Service and 10.30am Morning Worship. The theme Balm in Gilead. Coffee and Tea will be served in the St Matthew Hall after the services. Please remember to give an appropriate donation.
- 2. Autumn Lectures: This last Autumn lecture will be hosted in our Church and jointly supported by Greenbank and Fairmilehead Parish Churches. We meet for refreshments in the Braid Hall from 6.30pm and the lectures will be held in the Church at 7pm. The theme for this year's lectures will be, Ecology Matters, the wellbeing of Creation and Humanity.

21st September: Professor David Farrier is Professor of Literature and the Environment at the University of Edinburgh. He is the author Footprints: In search of Future Fossils. His work has been translated into ten languages. He will talk on his recently published book, 'Nature's Genius: Evolution's Lessons for a Changing Planet.'

- 3. Morningside Hope Dementia Friendly Concert with String Quartet, Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2pm, in the Church: This concert is open to everyone and will last approximately 40 45 minutes. Teas and coffees afterwards in the St Matthew Hall. Entry is by donation.
- Harvest 2025, 28th September at 10.30am (no 9.30am Early 4. Service that day) This year's Harvest Service provides us with an opportunity to donate to the Blythswood Care SE Edinburgh Foodbank based at Southhouse Broadway. The Foodbank serves the EH16 and EH17 postal areas and issues food parcels to those who have been referred to it by the health sector, support agencies and other charitable bodies. Last year SE Foodbank issued food to 1388 people, 40% of whom were children. This required 25 tonnes of food to provide these people with emergency support. Harvest is an important time of the year for Foodbanks, as it enables them to stock up on essential food and toiletries needed over the winter months. The items which are particularly in short supply at the moment include tinned meat, fish, vegetables and fruit, cooking sauces, coffee, tea, UHT milk, cereals, long life fruit juice, sponge puddings, jam and instant mash potato. If you would prefer to make a financial donation, this can be done via online banking - if you note that your donation is for the SE Foodbank, it will go directly into the SE Foodbank fund. Payment can be made to the named account Blythswood Care, the account number is 10413664 and the sort code 80-91-26. The Foodbank also requires plastic carrier bags, into which the goods for the clients are packed, so donations of these would also be welcome. Please hand any donations into the Braid Hall immediately before the 10.30am Service. The Foodbank cannot accept fresh fruit or vegetables or jars of homemade jam or marmalade. Also, please do remember when donating any items

that they must be in date. A number of members of the Congregation make donations of food and money throughout the year, but the Harvest Service is an occasion when everyone can be involved and contribute towards helping alleviate food poverty within our locality. Thank you in advance for your continued generosity – it is hugely appreciated by all those who use the Foodbank and by the volunteers who help run it. Finally, if anyone can help with receiving the food donations on the 28th, or is available (with a car!) to take the donations to Southhouse on the morning of Monday 29th, please contact Fiona Stewart on 531 9688 or see her at Church one Sunday – around 5 volunteers each day would be an enormous help.

The letter makes clear that without action now, the consequences of the crisis will be felt across society, from deepening inequalities to even greater pressure on the NHS and public services with Scotland's most vulnerable individuals and families paying the price. - Scotland Demands Better event: The Poverty Alliance, supported by the Church of Scotland, is organising a March for a Better Scotland in

Edinburgh, on **Saturday 25th October**. Change for the better happens when people stand together and demand it. Scotland needs that change. Too many of us are being cut off from life's essentials. Too many are frightened of what the future will bring. Too many of us are feeling tired, angry, isolated, and disillusioned. Too many are going hungry, or are without a home, or sacrificing meals for families, dreading winter due to heating costs, or struggling to get by on wages that don't cover their household costs. But from Shetland to Selkirk, and from Argyll to Angus, we all want similar things. A warm, safe place to call home. A decent income that at least covers the essentials. Healthcare when we need it. Good schools for our children. Buses and trains that get us where we need to go. Those of us who are elderly, ill or disabled getting the right support and care to live with dignity and respect. Scotland Demands Better is our chance to come together and demand that politicians make the changes we need for a society where every household can thrive and prosper. - iii. Admission by Resolution of the Kirk Session. If you're not sure where your membership lies, or you come from another Christian tradition, the Kirk Session can formally admit you into membership.

Whichever way, if you are thinking about joining, it will be good to welcome you into our Church family.
